Likewise if your circumstances have changed and you no longer pay tax please speak to your Section Leader or the Group Treasurer to cancel the mandate.

Once signed the mandate is applicable for as long as your child is in the Scout Group.



13th June – Nature Trek

The Pack met at the Fishlake Meadows Nature Reserve car park for an evening of wildlife spotting. Cubs were split into groups of 2 or 3 and set off with a photo trail of things to find, marking them off as we went. Cubs did manage to spot most things but was even better, they spotted other bugs and creepy crawlies that weren't on the list. We stopped on the way back for a biscuit treat but then had to hurry back to the car park, as we were running a bit late. Thanks to the parents that came along and a special thanks to Thuu from Mohicans for creating the trail.

20th and 27th June - Tomahawks and cooking split

Over these two weeks, we split the Pack with half doing Tomahawks whilst the other half did an ice cream cone desert on trench fires and then swapping over on the second week.

We were very fortunate to have the District Tomahawk team to come in and run the sessions for us, with strict instruction for this new sport/activity. Thanks to Tony and the team for running this at such short notice.

For the dessert cone, cubs had to build and light a trench fire and keep it fed to generate enough embers to cook on. Cubs then chose the contents to go into their cone from cherries, banana, strawberries, mallows, chocolate buttons, hundreds and thousands, raisins and Rolos! We then wrapped the cone in foil and put them in the embers of the fire for a few minutes. A couple of cones had been left on for a bit too long and were redone but the majority came out ok, very sweet and sticky, yum.

4th July – An American evening of sorts, with games of "baseball" (rounders) and hot dogs, complete with onions and ketchup. No tariffs on this one ②.

11th July – Water activities evening. We started the evening discussing how important and precious water is and the fact that we are so lucky to be able to just turn on a tap and out comes clean water. The cubs then took part in various water themed bases of cups with holes in, ladle run, sponge run, water rockets and the water tower. The cubs did get rather wet! We finished the evening with a water fight using water pistols and even buckets, where everyone got rather wet, great fun.
