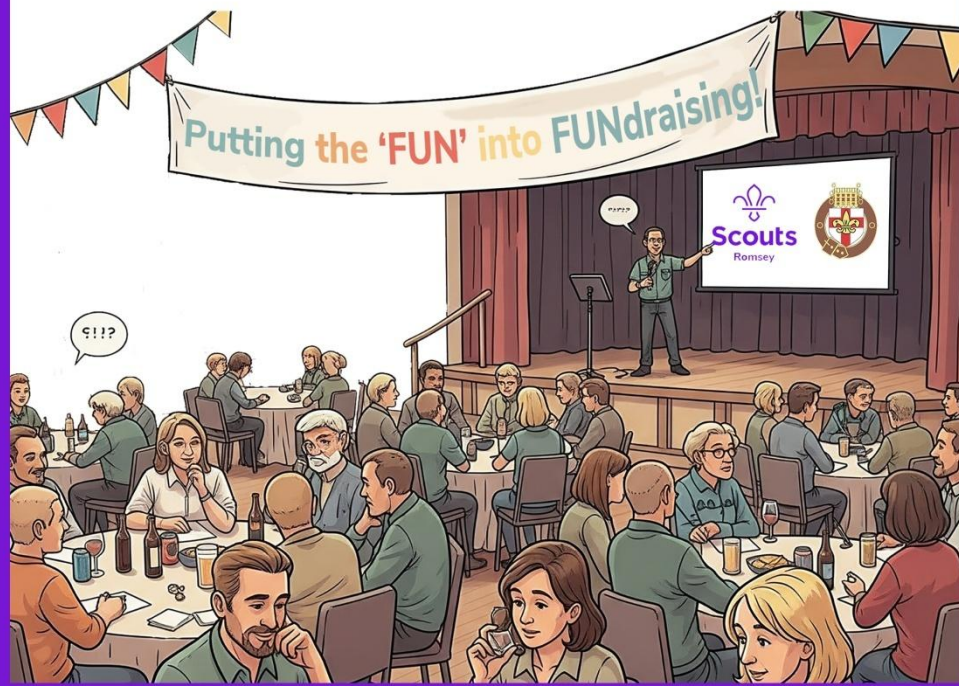

Please consider signing up for Gift Aid if you are eligible. You can register electronically through OSM.

No personal details are needed - just a signature to say that you are a tax payer.

For those who need one, a hard copy is printed at the end of this newsletter.

Please complete and return to your Section Leader.

Likewise if your circumstances have changed and you no longer pay tax please speak to your Section Leader or the Group Treasurer to cancel the mandate.

Once signed the mandate is applicable for as long as your child is in the Scout Group.

The lockdowns and restrictions prevented many fund-raising opportunities in the past few years.

So Gift Aid receipts have become even more important. If you have submitted a paper application in the past, please confirm your application in OSM.

The 10th - the Early Years

Woodley in the 1950s was a much different place - no Ganger Farm estate, no Great Woodley estate with a row of shops, no Brook Way, no Richmond Lane, just a gravel track and the old gravel pit being reclaimed by nature.

There was a pub, a church, a village school and shop and the Women's Institute hut. The Prisoner of War camp at Ganger had been taken over by the District Council, who had started to demolish the army barrack blocks and build council housing.

Ray Part had been a Scout Master with the Woodley & Braishfield Group in 1953/54. In 1959, his eldest son was of Cub age, so his mother-in-law 'encouraged' him to start up a Cub Pack. Her neighbour and fellow W.I. member was

Doris Bunting, a former Guider, and she became the first Secretary of the new Group. W.I. members seemed to have provided not only most of the new Wolf Cubs but also the members of the Committee and the fund-raisers.

At the first Pack meetings Akela Ray Part was helped by a Mr. Hendley(?) from another Group. Later Alec Lawes, a cousin of Doris Bunting, would become Assistant Cub Scout Master.

The first meeting place was the old Guide Hut behind the W.I. Hut in School Road. A larger meeting place was needed and Doris Bunting persuaded the District Council not to demolish the last barrack block at Ganger Camp, now called Woodley Close.

At the official opening, water was boiled up on a primus stove. Electricity was eventually connected and Doris Bunting remembered that the Committee had to hold a Jumble Sale quickly to raise money to pay the bill.
